# Future of Digital Art: 2025 Award Winners Announced at Phillips

A landmark awards ceremony at Phillips marked the launch of the inaugural Digital Art
Awards and a public exhibition of all 32 finalists, to open from 16–22 May 2025.

Highlighting innovation at the intersection of art and technology, the exhibition features works by the four category winners - Maja Petrić, Zach Lieberman, Deekay and Operator - each awarded a \$10,000 USDC commission. A special Industry Award was honoured the Yawanawá Indigenous community for their AI-driven collaboration with Refik Anadol, Winds of Yawanawá, supporting cultural and environmental preservation.

**LONDON, 16 May 2025** - The winners of the inaugural <u>Digital Art Awards</u>, which took place at <u>Phillips</u> in London last night, have been announced, recognising four artists across categories and a special Industry Award. Presented by <u>HOFA Gallery</u> in partnership with <u>PhillipsX</u> and <u>Hivemind Capital Partners</u>, the awards celebrate innovation and creativity in digital art, highlighting the evolving relationship between code, data, and human imagination. The four main winners, selected by an international jury panel, each received a \$10,000 USDC commission.

The ceremony also marked the opening of a public exhibition of all 32 finalists, on view at Phillips from Friday 16 May to 22 May. A press preview will be held this morning from 11am to 1pm.

From climate data transformed into luminous sculpture to immersive theatre, generative code, and animated storytelling, this year's awardees reflect the cutting edge of digital creativity. The awards, which were backed by Hivemind's newly launched Digital Culture Fund with a prize fund of \$40,000 USDC, recognised innovation across four categories - Innovation, Experiential, Still Image and Moving Image - alongside a Special Industry Award for a cross-cultural collaboration, reflecting the diversity and ambition of digital art today.

# Innovation Award: Maja Petrić

A former Lumen Prize winner whose work has been commissioned by National Geographic, Meta and Microsoft, Petrić is known for creating immersive installations that use light, AI, and real-time environmental data. She is the winner of the **2025 Digital Art Award for Innovation**, with her sculptural installation, *Specimens of Time: Hoh Rain Forest* (2025), celebrated for its powerful fusion of advanced technology and ecological awareness.

# Still Image Award: Zach Lieberman


An influential pioneer of creative coding, co-creator of the open-source toolkit openFrameworks and co-founder of the School for Poetic Computation in New York, Zach Lieberman has exhibited internationally, including at MoMA. He is the winner of the **2025 Digital Art Award for Still Image**, with his *Ripple Study* series recognised for using code to recreate natural phenomena, turning nature's subtle beauty into poetic digital art.

# Moving Image Award: DeeKay

A cult figure in the NFT and digital animation space, DeeKay is best known for his hand-drawn animated loops that blend humour, emotion and everyday storytelling. His breakout piece, Life and Death, sold for over \$1 million on SuperRare in 2022. DeeKay is the winner of the 2025 Digital Art Award for Moving Image, with his work *Hands of Time*, which uses minimal visuals and fluid motion to explore the fleeting nature of life, chosen for its emotional impact.

# **Experiential Award:** Operator

A multidisciplinary collective known for their nuanced integration of performance, surveillance, and spatial interaction, Operator creates immersive installations that interrogate systems of control and identity. Their work has been presented at venues including Ars Electronica, HEK Basel and Art Basel Miami. Human Unreadable, their groundbreaking choreography project, premiered on Art Blocks in 2023. They are the winners of the 2025 Digital Art Award for Experiential, with their latest iteration of *Human Unreadable* selected for its innovative blend of choreography, code and immersive technology.

## Industry Award: Yawanawá

Honouring their groundbreaking collaboration with media artist Refik Anadol, a special **Industry Award 2025** was awarded to the Yawanawá Indigenous people of the Brazilian Amazon. Accepted by Chief Nixiwaka on behalf of the community, the award celebrates their role in *Winds of Yawanawá* - a pioneering digital artwork that combines real-time environmental data, AI, and ancestral art to create a dynamic, cross-cultural storytelling experience supporting the community's cultural and environmental preservation.
